Boasting more than 800 km of shoreline, PEI is your oyster to explore. We have a number of scenic drives to ensure you don't miss an inch of the Island.

North Cape Coastal Drive is the northwestern part of the Island from Summerside to West Point and North Cape to Cascumpec.

Central Coastal Drive includes two separate drives. **Green Gables Shore** is located on the north side of the province, featuring the Gulf of St. Lawrence's soft sand beaches and Anne of Green Gables. **Red Sands Shore** is located on the south side of the province, with red sandy cliff beaches and the warm waters of the Northumberland Strait.



PEI POTATOES

Potato farming is deeply rooted in the history and culture of Prince Edward Island.

Some of the Island's earliest settlers pioneered the cultivation of potatoes in Canada. After more than two centuries, Island potato farmers continue to demonstrate the same pride, respect for the earth, and commitment to family tradition as their ancestors - always finding new ways to improve. Our farmers share a special bond with the Island's soil, many have grown up on the land they continue to farm.

96% of PEI potato farms are family owned, and that tradition isn't expected to change anytime soon.

The Island provides an ideal climate for growing potatoes. Cold, snowy winters break disease and pest cycles, while providing moisture for the next season. Summers are warm and provide adequate sunshine and rainfall to encourage growth and high yield harvests. The Island's famous red, sandy soil is rich in iron and other nutrients that give PEI potatoes their unique quality and flavor. There is something special about our million-acre farm, and there's certainly something special about the people who care for it.


For a small province, PEI has an abundance of incredible art.



BEACHES

Shorley you'll agree that our brilliant beaches are our finest feature.

Prince Edward Island is a beachgoer's paradise. You are never more than ten miles from the sea, and you are always close by to one of the Island's spectacular beaches.

This Island has something for everyone - whether it is a leisurely stroll on miles of white sand that you seek, time to try your hand at clam digging on our famous red shores or the chance to hear the famous "Singing Sands" at Basin Head Beach.

This Island has something unique to offer everyone – so dive in and let the fun begin!



Seasonally supervised.





RIP CURRENTS are powerful, fast-moving currents that can pull you away from shore. Even in moderate surf, a rip current can move 1.5 meters per second.

Beach Safety:Break the Grip of the Rip!

Our oceans are beautiful but they can be dangerous. Respect the ocean and the changing conditions to stay safe at the beach. If you have questions, talk to the surfguards!

Caught in a rip?

- · Stay calm. Attract attention. Conserve energy.
- · Do not swim against the current.
- Tread water. Waves can assist you back to shore.
- Swim parallel to shore out of the current-toward the breaking waves.

INFLATABLES are never allowed in supervised swim areas. When strong offshore winds are present, inflatables and small watercraft (inflatable boats/chairs/mattresses, paddleboards, kayaks, kiteboards, canoes, etc.) are not recommended for use at any time. Even during calm or moderate surf conditions, strong offshore winds can carry inflatables and small watercraft away from the shore quickly.

Know before you go. When in doubt, don't go out!

- Never swim alone.
- · Observe surf conditions. Follow surfguard advice.
- · Swim between the red and yellow flags of the surfguard area.
- If surf is present, beware of rip currents.
- Rip currents have calmer water with fewer breaking waves.

Other Important Tips

- Keep children under supervision.
- Be sun safe. Cover up. Wear SPF. Rent or bring a sunshade.
- Stay hydrated bring water in a refillable container.



Pass along the sea shore, by farm pastures and woodlots, and through many small communities. An excursion on our **Confederation Trail** is a must-do for your vacation, whether you walk a small section in one of our cities, or cycle the whole tip-to-tip distance.

MUST-SEE PEI BEACHES

Prince Edward Island is a beach destination with more than 800km of beaches along its 1,100km of shoreline. It's the perfect place to experience where the ocean meets the sandy shore. The hardest part of your day might be deciding which beach is right for you!

Basin Head Beach

Run your feet through the sand at Basin Head Beach and it will sing! This beach is one of Prince Edward Island's provincial parks and with that comes all the amenities you could need, including bathrooms and a canteen.

Cavendish Beach

This is PEI's most well-known PEI National Park beach. Cavendish Beach is miles of white sand surrounded by protected sand dunes. The beach is located right in the heart of Cavendish and is a convenient spot to escape with the family. Explore the walking trails or take part in the captivating interpretive programs on beach ecology and wildlife.

Greenwich Beach

Greenwich Beach is part of PEI National Park and is one of those star attractions that Islanders try to keep to themselves. It has the largest sand dunes on the Island with boardwalks and trails that roll across the marshes and grass. The pristine sand seems to go on forever making it paradise for anyone who loves a long walk in the gentle waves.

Jacques Cartier Beach

Jacques Cartier Beach is in Jacques Cartier Provincial Park. This provincial park is near the top of the northern cape of Prince Edward Island. Here, the campsites and picnic tables have unobstructed panoramic views of the ocean. Beach volleyball and horseshoes are beach classics, there's a playground and day use park for picnicking.

Panmure Island Beach

Panmure Island Beach is a long white sandy beach shouldered by sweeping sand dunes and vast ocean views. Much-loved by locals and visitors alike, Panmure Island is truly a beach-lover's paradise. This beach is one of Prince Edward Island's provincial parks and with that comes all the amenities you need – showers, bathrooms, and a kitchen shelter.

Chelton Beach

Chelton Beach is near the community of Bedeque along the red shore of southwest PEI. It's located within Chelton Beach Provincial Park where you'll find parking, a playground, picnic tables, washroom facilities. Low tide provides the best opportunity for exploring the flats and tidal pools, watch for crabs underfoot! Fans love it for the warm water, views of Confederation Bridge and low-key vibe.



West Point Beach

West Point Beach is located in the Cedar Dunes Provincial Park offering miles of beautiful red sandy beach. This beach is great to explore the shoreline and look for sea glass. Plus, the black and white striped West Point Lighthouse makes for a great photo op! This south shore beach has warm waters so don't miss out on going for a dip.

One of PEI's longest standing (and most heartwarming traditions) is coming together for a Ceilidh. Local performers showcase their talents in intimate music halls, community centres, and churches, entertaining audiences across the Island. There's never a dull moment at a Ross Family Ceilidh as they showcase Celtic and Acadian roots music through catchy songs and haunting ballads, with no shortage of driving fiddle sets and stunning step-dancing sprinkled in between!





MUST VISIT PEI LIGHTHOUSES

The lighthouses of Prince Edward Island are some of the Island's most iconic landmarks. Along our 1,100km of coastline, dozens of lighthouses can be found dotting the bright red cliffs. They symbolize strength in the face of adversity and finding direction in challenging times. Surrounded by wild waters and windswept cliffs, their light has been a comforting beacon on dark nights for generations. While exploring their beauty by day you'll feel the wind whip through your hair, smell the salt and take in some of the most stunning panoramic views PEI has to offer.

Covehead Lighthouse

Covehead is home to PEI's smallest and most charming lighthouse. Because of the evershifting sandbars, the 8.2m structure has been moved and modified a few times since its original construction in 1967.

Cape Bear Lighthouse

Cape Bear Lighthouse, built in 1881, is a typical example of second-generation lighthouse design. It houses one of seven Marconi Wireless Stations established by Marine and Fisheries in 1905-06. Here at the southeastern tip of PEI, Thomas Bartlett heard the first distress signal from the Titanic as it sank off Newfoundland in 1912.




West Point Lighthouse

The West Point Lighthouse is a distinctively designed 20.6m wooden lighthouse that was built in 1875 to guide vessels through the western entrance to the Northumberland Strait. Today, the West Point lighthouse offers the rare opportunity to sleep like a lighthouse keeper!

North Cape Lighthouse

The need for a North Cape Lighthouse was obvious to mariners from as far back as 1534 when Jacques Cartier wrote of the dangerous rocky shoal, the longest in North America. It was built in 1865 and is one of three similar octagonal, wood-framed tower lighthouses that are some of the oldest of this style still standing in the Maritimes.



Point Prim Lighthouse

Point Prim Lighthouse has guided vessels through the southeastern entrance to Hillsborough Bay at the outer approach to Charlottetown Harbour since 1845. Point Prim is the oldest lighthouse on the Island and one of only a handful in the country that are made of brick. The harsh weather took a toll on the brick and it had to be shingled just two years after construction.

Seacow Head Lighthouse

Seacow Head Lighthouse is one of the three sister lighthouses built in the same tall, octagonal shape. Along with Cape Jourimain, it has provided navigation for vessels passing through the narrowest point of the Northumberland Strait since 1863. This stunning lighthouse sits atop a long red sandstone cliff that creeps nearer with each crashing wave as erosion has its way with the earth.

Wood Islands Lighthouse

Wood Islands Lighthouse stands 15.2m at the entrance to the ferry docks and has been an important navigational aid since 1876. Now, the active lighthouse is open for daily tours and the six room, two-storey keeper's dwelling houses a nautical craft shop and a breathtaking 360-degree tower top view.
